Race Meeting - Friday 22nd August - Sunday 24th August 2025

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS: Version 2

- 1. Silverstone Circuits Ltd. will promote an international and interclub race meeting on the Silverstone Grand Prix circuit incorporating the Historic Vale Section which is 3.649miles (5.87km) long from Friday August 22nd to Sunday August 24th 2025. The event will be organised by the Historic Sports Car Club Ltd. (HSCC) and GOOSE Live Events which known as The Silverstone Festival. The organiser reserves the right to alter the circuit configuration to that of the GP circuit for the FIA series or Championships if necessary.
- 2. The Meeting will be held under the general regulations of Motorsport UK (MSUK) (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), the individual Series Regulations, these supplementary regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event. Motorsport UK has sanctioned this race meeting as a National Competition with Approved Foreign Participation.
- 3. Permit Number: 203107 (International), 203405 (Interclub) and 203108 (National).
- **4. Eligibility:** The meeting is open to members of the HSCC and registered members of invited Series and Championships as listed.
- 5. A National licence or above is required for the International Trophy for Classic GT Cars, Motor Racing Legends Historic Touring Cars, Historic Grand Prix Cars Association Pre'66 Grand Prix Cars, Motor Racing Legends Pre '61 Sports cars and Pre '63 GT Cars, Motor Racing Legends GT3 Legends
- **6. A FIA International C** Licence or above is required for Masters Racing Legends, Masters Sports Cars Legends, Masters Group C and Masters Endurance Legends. A minimum MSUK Club licence is required for Masters Transatlantic Pre'66 Touring Cars, HSCC Derek Bell Trophy, 500cc OA and FJHRA Historic Formula Junior.
- 7. The MASTERS FIA International Series are governed by the following regulations, in order of precedence:
 - a. The FIA International Sporting Code (ISC) including appendices,
 - b. The Series Sporting and Technical Regulations as published,
 - c. These Supplementary Event Regulations, including any modifications and bulletins issued by the Event Organisers or by the Stewards of the Competition,
 - d. The FIA Code of Ethics.
 - e. General Relations of Motorsport UK (MSUK) as applicable
- **8.** The Masters Pre-66 Touring Cars and Gentlemen Drivers series will be run in conformity with Motorsport UK NCR, their Sporting and Technical Regulations, the latter being aligned with the safety and technical prescription of the FIA's Appendix K.
- 9. Races: The meeting will consist of races for the following categories of cars:

Friday 22nd August

Qualifying for all Races will take part on Friday 25th August

Saturday 23rd August

Historic Formula Junior, Royal Automobile Club Woodcote Trophy & Stirling Moss Trophy, Derek Bell Trophy, Motor Racing Legends GT3 Legends, Masters Racing Legends (Formula 1'66 - '85), Masters Endurance Legends, Transatlantic Trophy for Pre'66 Touring Cars, HGPCA pre '66 Grand Prix Cars, International Trophy for Classic GT Cars (Pre'65) Masters Group C.

Sunday 24th August

Historic Formula Junior, RAC Historic Tourist Trophy, Derek Bell Trophy, Adrian Flux Trophy for Motor Racing Legends Historic Touring Car Challenge, 500cc F3, Masters Racing Legends (Formula 1'66 – '85), HGPCA Pre'66 Grand Prix Cars, Masters Endurance Legends. Masters GT Trophy, Masters Sports Car Legends.

It should be noted that the above is the preliminary race schedule and may be subject to modification or alteration without further consultation.

- **10. Scrutineering** will occur on Thursday 21st August and Friday 22nd August, at the times designated in the competitor's timetable and the areas specified in the competitor's final instructions. All vehicles must comply with their FIA or relevant series identity documents which must be available for inspection.
- **11. Starts**: All grids will have a rolling start and the grid formation will be 2 x 2 for all cars. Competitors final instructions will denote the type of start for each group racing. Grid positions will be determined by practice times for race 1 and as per race group regulations for race 2.
- **12. Practice**: Drivers must complete 3 laps to qualify for a place on the grid. Drivers who are allowed to qualify out of session will start from the back of the grid.
- **13. Numbers:** All vehicles must display numbers and roundels in accordance NCR 7.13 Drawing 1 Competitions Numbers of the Motorsport UK General Regulations.
- **14. Pits:** Cars entering the pits during practice or racing must use the pit entry road. Failure to observe pit marshal's lawful instructions may lead to exclusion from the meeting.
- **15. Judges,** who will be deemed to be Judges of Fact, will be appointed to adjudicate on noise, false/jump starts, finishing order, crossing a penalty line and yellow flag infringements.
- **16. Awards:** The promoters will present trophies for first, second and third places overall in each race. Each Series organiser may present other Class Awards. See the final instructions for awards ceremony details. Awards not collected on the day will be forfeited.
- **17. Entries:** The opening and closing date for entries are subject to the conditions set by the invited race organising groups and MSUK or FIA rules will take precedence. The Organisers reserve the right to select or refuse entries. Refunds please refer to your individual organisers for their refund policy. Correctly filled-in entry forms will be required. Reserves will be accepted in accordance with circuit capacity and your group policy.
- **18. Silencing:** All cars must comply with their championship or series regulations.
- **19. Entry Fee:** As per the entry form supplied by your race series co-ordinators. Entry forms are to be returned to the race series co-ordinators. Payments are to be made to your organising series/club.
- **20. Nominated Drivers**: Driver nominations may be deferred but under no circumstances may a driver compete without signing the appropriate indemnity declaration. NCR 3.4.1
- **21. The Organisers** reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the meeting or any part thereof. In the event of postponement, abandonment or cancellation, the Organisers and Promoters will not be liable for any loss or expense incurred by entrants or drivers.

National / Interclub Protests must be made in accordance with NCR 2.9.1-2.9.4. Any Protests in regard to the International Results must be submitted in accordance with the FIA ISC and will be referred to the Stewards of the Event.
- **24.** Race Results will be based on the finishing order determined by the Chief Timekeeper and/or Judges of Fact.
